

From the desk of Secretary General 2023

National Neonatology Forum (NNF) remains at the forefront of shaping policy in perinatal and neonatal care, partnering with state governments and both national and international agencies. Our initiatives in Facility-Based Newborn Care (FBNC), accreditation, fellowships, mentoring, and evaluation continue to set benchmarks for neonatal care in India.

Members can now manage their memberships and payments online seamlessly through newly developed interactive NNF Website https://nnfi.org. Members can now access UpToDate, the comprehensive advanced and latest research resource, at discounted rates via exclusive discounted subscription offers especially for postgraduate students. NNF Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) Training of Trainers (TOT) workshops have now been conducted nationwide with the latest IAP-NNF-NRP textbook. Third edition of Advanced NRP Workshop manual has been released in 2024.

NNF ShINe, Short course In Neonatology for a period of 12 weeks have been organised in which almost 2000 and more first year postgraduate resident doctors, across 400 or so medical colleges and equal number of DNB institutions, participated actively. Fifty and more skill based workshops at 2nd week and 10th week of course were concurrently organised across India. Similarly, various rounds viz, college, divisional, zonal, and national of NNF Quiz for doctors and nurses are being conducted annually wherein all postgraduate doctors and neonatal nurses participate.

We have successfully conducted workshops in Neonatal ventilation, NEOMAP, NeoQuIP, Research Methodology etc. NNF-PGI workshop on neurodevelopment will have BSID with certificate, DASII, HINE, HNNE etc is being organised. NNF's role in advocacy and championing the cause of vulnerable mothers and babies has been acknowledged by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare regarding the preparation of a bill against the commercialization of human milk. NNF Committee on Breastmilk and Breastfeeding Support, Promotion and Protection (NNF B2 S P2) took out a position statement on the Commercialisation of Neonatal and Young Infant Feeding Practices, which has been submitted to the government.

NNF since 2000 or so have been conducting Quality Certification and Accreditation of newborn units across India with almost 300 neonatal units being regularly monitored and accredited by NNF for last two decades or so. New web based online accreditation application has smoothened the whole process. NNF fellowship program to provide specialty training in neonatology to doctors and nurses has churned out newborn specialist doctors and nurses who are now in charge of many secondary level neonatal units across India; Neonatal Online Education and Learning (NOEL) for nurses and doctors have ensured uniform knowledge and skills of trainee fellows in these units.

The NNF Journal, in collaboration with our esteemed publishing partner SAGE, is free to all NNF members who have completed online registration. Most worldwide journals have shifted to an online-only mode, and the Journal of Neonatology made this transition in 2020, with physical copies being made available to only those institutions and individuals who subscribe to it on payment. We are proud to announce a significant increase in submissions, growing from 400 to 600 pages of valuable content, a testament to our members' expanding interest and contributions.

We are on track to achieve PubMed indexing, in coming years which will enhance the visibility and accessibility of our research on a global scale. This milestone will strengthen the journal's credibility and open doors for more international collaborations and contributions, positioning NNF as a key player in neonatal research worldwide.

I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to the Organizing Chairperson, Dr. A. T. Arasar Seeralar, the Organizing Secretary, Dr. S. Srinivasan, and the entire organizing team for their unwavering dedication and tireless efforts in bringing NEOCON 2024 to life. dr Suksham Jain am thankful on behalf of my team for this responsibility of online learning sessions for Nurses.

The activity began with the creation of What'sapp and email group. Suggestions were invited from all members regarding methods of training nurses, topics of training and timing of the classes.

t was decided that the invite for classes will be sent to the current and previous batch both as some of the nurse fellows do not write the exam in the same year as of fellowship. A zoom meeting was conducted among the faculty members of Noel group to reach to consensus.

Classes (around 10-11) were held every Wednesday from 2.20-3.30 pm on the various topics of clinical skills of neonatal nursing. The response was enthusiastic with around 70-100 nurses in each session. The presentations were interactive with onsite videos guided by the training centre. The interactive session was kept longer than the presentation and was continued till all queries were cleared off. An open invitation was given to nurses to clear off doubts via email even after the last session. Overall it was a successful activity for mentors and participants both.

NNF has had path breaking innovations in the field of online teaching. This has been especially true for the online teaching modules for nurses and doctors on important topics related to the day to day care of the sick newborn babies. The modules are well structured with a good number of teaching videos added for better understanding of the topic. The teaching sessions were well paced which provided good opportunities for self learning followed by discussion on Whatsapp group. The interjection of Whatsapp poll questions to improve the engagement of the participants was a successful intervention as it resulted in increased participation in the group. Regular webinars also gave ample opportunities to the participants to actively present and participate in the learning process. It also helped the mentors to not only teach but also to gain new knowledge in each session. I feel we can continue with these online courses on a regular basis and perhaps for teh future get the Fellowships accredited by the Nursing Council. (Dr Rashna Dass Hazarika,)

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Annual Report of Accreditation Committee of NNF

On behalf of the Accreditation Committee of NNF it is a pleasure to table the two year report of our activities. The committee took charge in Jan 2023 for a period of two years. The task of the committee was to review the assessors' reports of on- site inspection for accreditation. The committee was also asked to determine eligibility of the concerned units for participating in the NNF Fellowship Program.

As far as accreditation of units is concerned, as all are aware, there are detailed self- assessment forms for various levels of accreditation available on the NNF website. Each unit whether applying first time or for reaccreditation is expected to fill and email the form to the NNF office. Very recently the system has been simplified and this form is now to be filled online by institute concerned as well as by the on- site assessors. This self assessment form along with the assessors comments is reviewed by the members of the accreditation committee and discussed in the monthly meeting. All mandatory criteria are expected to be fulfilled as well as atleast 75% of the qualifying criteria. For academic accreditation, as per the existing NNF rules, units with accreditation as Level II B and above are eligible to participate in the fellowship program provided they have adequate clinical material including minimum annual admissions of not less than 300 to the unit, adequate babies needing respiratory support, adequate VLBW and ELBW admissions. The committee also looks at the opportunity for adequate training of the candidates in neonatal resuscitation and for stand-alone neonatal units insists on MOU with nearby maternity homes for the students to attend deliveries and conduct resuscitation under supervision of unit seniors. These cli nical requirements were felt necessary to ensure the fellowship candidates at the various institutes have clinical exposure sufficient to emerge as confident practitioners of rational neonatal care at the end of their training. Besides this, the committee also reviews the academic accreditation data of the unit with regards to proposed teachers' experience, their participation / conducting academic activities, publications from the unit as well as the number of candidates passing the exit exam at first attempt.

Where ever deficiencies are noted, the unit is informed by the NNF office and the units are asked to submit compliance report of rectification of deficiencies. We are happy to state that during our tenure we have reviewed 27 first time applications and 37 reaccreditation reports in 2023 and 11 first time and 51 reaccreditation applications in 2024. On behalf of my self and Dr. Arvind Shenoi, co-chair of the committee, we wish to say a big thankyou to all the members of the AC of 2023 & 2024 listed below for their untiring efforts. We also take this opportunity to thank Past President, NNF Dr. Praveen Kumar and current President Dr. Sushma Nangia for reposing faith in us as members of the NNF Accreditation Committee.

NNF Fellowship committee report of activities for the year 2024

The committee conducted the exit examinations for doctors and nurses

Grievances of centres pertaining to student leave criteria, eligibility of students, re-evaluation was addressed.

The committee wishes to appreciate the humongous and sincere work of staff Ms Neetu.

The fellowship committee was significantly benefited by the processes that existed as valuable work done by previous members – Dr Umesh Vaidya, Dr Praveen Kumar, Dr Surinder Bisht as leaders and members of the committee and thanks the current president Dr Sushma Nangia for guidance and support.

Some of the process changes implemented over the last 2 years include

Transparency in conduct of exams – complete details of the exam process are shared on zoom platform, and as a document with examiners, students and exam centres. This ensures that there is transparency and uniformity in conduct of exams and evaluation.

Defining marking scheme for long and short cases. This ensures fair assessment of all domains.

Opportunity to host exams and be examiners – the NNF office invites all the accredited exam centres to host the exit exams. Also, all faculty of the accredited centres are nvited to be examiners, if they meet eligibility criteria. Each session included young examiners (who have never been examiners before). This process improves nclusiveness, gives opportunity to young teachers, helps in capacity building. Also, these examiners are exposed to exam questions. They can thus improve the teaching at heir own centres

ncrease in exam centres to 5 over the last 2 years from 4 centres previously and 5 examiners per centre from 4 previously; this has definitely increased expenses but has educed the number of candidates per day, allowing more time and decreasing stress.

Nursing exams were clubbed with doctor's exams. This brings the nurses on an equal platform. This also reduces the workload on the office. The nursing examiners have been empowered by defined time and marks in the exam.

Digital communication – many of the paper-based applications and hall tickets have been replaced largely by emails.

Report of the activities of the "NNF Breastmilk and Breastfeeding Support, Promotion and Protection (B2 S P2) Committee " 2024

The committee accomplished following tasks:

Development of a Position Statement on Commercialisation of Neonatal and Young Infants Feeding Practices:

With the expert input of all the esteemed members, the committee developed the statement which highlights the importance of breastfeeding/breastmilk feeding in neonatal and infant health; status of breastfeeding/breastmilk feeding in India; barriers to practice successful breastfeeding in the health care facilities; commercial interference in the neonatal and infant feeding practices; commercialisation of donor human milk; ethical issues/risks related to commercial interference in neonatal and young child feeding practices. The statement emphasised role of early and exclusive breastfeeding in preventing neonatal morbidity and mortality. It also highlighted the importance of enabling health facilities to follow breastfeeding friendly policies and practices.

The statement was submitted to the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Government of India with the request to take effective steps to stop the commercialisation of neonatal and young infants feeding practices. It was discussed in a meeting specially convened by the MOHFW, GOI under the chairmanship of the Director General Health Services, Government of India. The President, NNF made the key presentation in the meeting.

Based on the discussion on the issue of commercialisation of the breastmilk, NNF President and SG wrote a letter to the honourable Prime Minister to include the subject in his monthly Man Kee Baat programme https://nnfi.org/assests/upload/announcement-

The panel discussion included issues like paby food companies resorting to engage health care facilities and health care providers in promoting their brands and products, practices in the NICU which may discourage these manufacturers to push their products (e.g. neonatal BFHI) esponse of UN agencies, Governments, and the Professional organisations to protect breastfeeding from commercial influence of baby food companies juideline/policy from the UN agencies on sales of donor human milk olicy/guideline/action from Government of India on the marketing of breastmilk for rofit, tactics being used by the baby food and allied industry to promote thei products through the health care facilities, ethical dilemmas and risks associated vith the commercial use of donor human milk, NNF's position on for-profit marketing of donor human milk and products based on it. The webinar was attended by 156 AP and NNF members.

Necrotizing enterocolitis: Revisiting the paradigm

Although staging of intestinal dysfunctional severity (Bell's Staging Criteria and subsequent adaptations) has been a mainstay of neonatal intensive care since the 1970's, infants diagnosed with Stage 1 or 2 likely do not have intestinal necrosis. In fact, stage 1 is such a diffuse set of symptoms and signs that most extremely low birth weight infants exhibit these during their neonatal hospital course. Stage 2 has been highly dependent on radiographic signs such as pneumatosis intestinalis. This is often misdiagnosed and/or overread by radiologists and neonatologists. Such overreading frequently results in unnecessary and potentially harmful measures, such as prolonged antibiotics and disruption of enteral feedings, which are known to alter the intestinal microbial ecosystem and mucosal immune defenses and increases cost of care. Stage 3 usually prompts surgical intervention, either laparotomy or peritoneal drain placement. When peritoneal drains are placed, bowel is not directly visualized, hence generating confusion as to whether the bowel is necrotic. Most patients diagnosed with "NEC" show no definitive necrosis, hence the term is a misnomer.

What is currently termed necrotizing enterocolitis ("NEC") in neonates is not a clearly defined disease. This represents a major conundrum in neonatology and is an underlying reason for the lack of preventive strategies. There is a need to revise the current paradigm of "NEC" with a nuanced taxonomy of preterm neonatal intestinal injuries leading to targeted highly effective preventative strategies. Unsupervised machine learning (ML) will expose this nuanced taxonomy of the set of neonatal intestinal injuries and dysfunctions currently termed NEC.

Newly developed technologies involving integrated multiomics will delineate the unique pathophysiology within each newly described taxonomic cluster and discriminate the mechanistic features between the clusters. Using systems biology, biomarkers unique to individual clusters will be discovered, which will lead to early risk prediction and effective preventative strategies. Although nuanced phenotypic clustering is an important intermediate goal, a better delineation of the pathophysiologic and mechanistic features within each cluster using systems biology schemes is an important next step. It will aid in the development of clinically relevant diagnostic biomarkers with the potential for early detection and development of preventative strategies.

Surfactant: Hits and misses

Replacement surfactant therapy represents one of the major advances in the modern era of neonatology. Traditionally, it was delivered via an endotracheal tube and babies remained intubated and ventilated for hours to days after its administration. Studies including the COIN[1] and SUPPORT[2] trials showed that many extremely preterm babies can be successfully managed from birth on continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) and given "rescue" surfactant therapy once they developed signs of respiratory distress syndrome, often defined in terms of an inspiratory oxygen requirement of 50% or more. It was subsequently shown that an FiO2 >0.30 in the first hours of life reliably predicts later need for surfactant therapy. Infants who reached this threshold had higher rates of pneumothorax, bronchopulmonary dysplasia (BPD) and mortality than those who managed on CPAP alone.[3]

The technique of less invasive surfactant administration (LISA), also known as minimally invasive surfactant therapy (MIST), enables babies managed on CPAP to be given surfactant via a thin catheter without the need for an endotracheal tube. This technique showed promise, and individual trials and meta-analyses suggest that the technique reduces rates of BPD.[4, 5] Importantly, recent data from the Optimist trial suggests that the use of MIST is associated with a decreased rate of readmission to hospital (for any cause or for respiratory illness specifically) in the first two years of life.[6] A reduction in symptoms of wheeze and diagnosis of asthma was also reported. Implementation studies have shown that care should be taken when introducing LISA into routine care.[7] Operators with substantial experience and standardised protocols are required to ensure safe application of the technique.

BPD remains a major cause of short and long term morbidity for extremely preterm infants. After many trials, the list of effective therapies is relatively short and includes caffeine, early CPAP, volume targeted ventilation and LISA. Systemic corticosteroid therapy reduces rates of BPD but is associated with many unwanted side-effects including hypertension, hyperglycaemia and gastrointestinal haemorrhage. Combining artificial surfactant with budesonide showed great promise in reducing rates of BPD in a series of small RCTs. However, the PLUSS trial which recruited more than 1000 infants <28 weeks failed to show an important reduction in BPD or other neonatal outcomes.[8]

Rates of BPD remain unacceptably high. Surfactant has an important role in managing extremely preterm infants at high risk of BPD. Further refinements of timing of administration, corticosteroid administration and development of new drugs are required.

Neonatal Shock: Pressing need for an ideal vasopressor

Management of neonatal hypotension and hypoperfusion is challenging. The goal of management of hypotension is to optimize perfusion and oxygen delivery to the tissues – especially brain. There is no standard definition of neonatal hypotension although blood pressures below 3rd or 5th percentile corrected for gestational age and postnatal age may be practical. However, many infants have normal perfusion despite low measured blood pressure values ("permissive" hypotension) and treatment of hypotension can be associated with negative outcomes. In addition to accurate blood pressure measurements, targeted neonatal echocardiography, assessment of right and left ventricular function, determination of superior vena cava (SVC) flow, oxygen saturation by pulse oximetry (SpO2) and near infrared spectroscopy (NIRS) are important to manage neonatal hypoperfusion. All blood pressure measurements (systolic, diastolic, and mean) need to be serially recorded as trends in these numbers reflect changes in pathophysiology and dictate therapeutic strategies. 1

Preterm and term neonates pose unique challenges for management of hypotension. Cerebral autoregulation is lost following asphyxia and also in extreme prematurity rendering pressure-passive blood flow to the brain. The critical closing pressure for cerebral circulation in preterm infants is not known and is considered to be between 19 and 30 mmHg.

If hypoperfusion or hypotension is secondary to suspected blood or fluid loss and reduced central venous pressure (CVP) can be confirmed, a fluid bolus of 10-20 ml/kg with either a crystalloid (normal saline or Ringer's lactate solution) or blood products are the most appropriate initial therapy. If hypoperfusion and hypotension persist, ideally a point-of-care cardiac ultrasound is performed. Cardiac function is assessed, and appropriate therapy (inotrope or vasopressor) is initiated with close monitoring of blood pressure (table 1).

Table 1. Choice of medications when pulmonary hypertension and systemic hypotension coexist. Inhaled nitric oxide can be used in all these situations.


Agents that cause vasoconstriction without inotropy (vasopressors e.g., vasopressin, phenylephrine and in most clinical circumstances, norepinephrine), should be used with caution in patients with poor cardiac function as increased afterload can further impair cardiac function. In conditions with cardiac dysfunction without systemic hypotension, milrinone or dobutamine provide inotropy. In patients with perinatal asphyxia induced cardiac dysfunction, presence of associated liver and kidney dysfunction can prolong the half-life of medications such as sildenafil and milrinone respectively leading to significant systemic hypotension. Catecholamine-resistant hypotension may necessitate initiation of hydrocortisone provided the likelihood of sepsis is low.

The overall goal of management of systemic hypotension is to improve perfusion and oxygen delivery to the tissues, especially brain and heart without causing pulmonary vasoconstriction and worsening pulmonary hypertension).

Advances in neonatal resuscitation

For the purpose of this presentation, I will focus on four controversies in neonatal resuscitation: cord management, initial oxygenation in preterm, epinephrine and when to switch from the neonatal resuscitation program (NRP) algorithm to pediatric advanced life support (PALS).

Cord management: Recommendations for umbilical cord management were recently updated by ILCOR (November 2024, figure 1). Deferred cord clamping (DCC ≥30s, preferably ≥60s) can be beneficial at all gestational ages if immediate resuscitation is not needed. If DCC cannot be performed, intact umbilical cord milking (iUCM) may be reasonable compared to (cf.) early cord clamping in late preterm and term infants between 35-42 weeks. However, iUCM is absolutely contraindicated in extremely preterm infants < 28 weeks of gestation.


Oxygenation of preterm infants: Resuscitation of term infants should be resuscitated with 21% oxygen and titrated to achieve desired SpO2. Term infants with suspected pulmonary hypertension (PPHN) such as congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH) may also begin resuscitation with 21% oxygen, although \sim 50% oxygen may be preferred. Moderately preterm infants should be initially resuscitated with 21-30% oxygen. Extremely preterm infants, especially those < 26 weeks gestation have been observed to have lower mortality when resuscitation is initiated with higher concentrations of oxygen (\sim 100%). Several trials are being conducted to figure out the optimal initial concentration of oxygen in extremely preterm infants (TORPIDO 30/60, DOXIE) and will dictate future guidelines.


Epinephrine: The NRP recommends 0.1 mg/kg of epinephrine by the tracheal route while attempting to obtain intravenous or intraosseous access. The efficacy of tracheal epinephrine in delivery room resuscitation is questionable due to poor absorption in animal studies. However, in observational clinical studies, some infants do achieve return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) following tracheal epinephrine.

NRP recommends a dose of 0.02 mg/kg epinephrine followed by 3 ml flush. This flush volume may be appropriate for a term infant but excessive for an extremely preterm infant. Optimal flush volume in a preterm infant that does not increase IVH needs to be evaluated.

NRP vs. PALS: While it is generally accepted that NRP algorithm is best suited for delivery room resuscitation and PALS is ideal for older infants and children, it is not clear as to how postneonatal infants in the NICU should be resuscitated. The salient differences between NRP and PALS are shown in the table below. In general, if the resuscitating team is more familiar with one algorithm, it is better to use that algorithm irrespective of the patient's age. PALS algorithm does have more medications and additional scenarios that are more likely in postneonatal infants.

Fundamental principles of monitoring preterm weight gain that every paediatrician should know

A cardinal component of neonatal practice is monitoring weight gain for which clinicians use "growth" charts. In this short lecture I will discuss the implications of using current "growth" charts and illustrate how very preterm babies really gain weight in practice today.

Most current "growth" charts depict the median weight for gestational age, with symmetric centiles above and below (e.g. the 3rd, 10th and 25th below and the 75th, 90th and 97th above). It is important to understand that preterm charts are usually developed from cross-sectional data from infants born preterm, not from longitudinal measures obtained from individual infants. Therefore, they are birth measurement charts, not growth charts.

Babies born preterm have usually suffered fetal growth restriction. This is shown by the birthweight of babies born preterm usually being less than the weight of equivalent gestational age fetuses remaining in utero. Thus, at 28-32 weeks gestation, the 50th centile for birthweight compares approximately with the 10th centile for fetal weight.

The curves in preterm charts plot a trajectory to reach the weight of a full-term baby at term. Therefore, if you aim to make a very preterm baby gain weight following a "growth" chart, you are trying to make them reach the weight of a baby born at full-term, at or before term. This means you will be forcing accelerated weight gain to achieve catch-up to the weight of babies that remained in utero to term. However, a preterm baby following intrauterine weight velocity will weigh less at full-term than term-born babies.

The conundrum for neonatologists is that over 8 decades of research in every species studied including humans shows a clear relationship between accelerated weight gain, especially after a period of growth restriction, and greater risk of age-related chronic diseases and shorter lifespan. We should therefore consider the possibility that promoting rapid early weight gain might exacerbate these risks.

Preterm babies need adequate nutrition, but faster weight gain is not always necessarily better. Note also that anthropometry at full-term does not predict later neurodevelopment. breast fed babies gain weight more slowly than formula fed babies but have better neurodevelopmental outcomes, and no clinical trials to-date targeting faster third trimester weight gain have shown neurodevelopmental or other benefits

We examined whole-population data from the UK National Neonatal Research Database on infants admitted to neonatal units in England and Wales over a 12-year period. We found that in very preterm infants surviving without major morbidity, despite substantial variation in nutritional practice, weight at term is consistently below birthweight centile and weight velocity in all gestational age groups stabilises around 32-34 weeks postmenstrual age at 16-25 g/day along parallel centile lines. This suggests that postnatal weight gain in the third trimester follows a pre-set velocity, as is the case throughout childhood.

An advance for newborn care would be the development of charts based on longitudinal measurements. However, we 150 should not forget that optimal postnatal weight gain after very preterm birth is currently unknown.

How to use observational data for high-impact outputs that advance newborn care

Observational data can be used for several types of high-impact studies to improve the evidence base for newborn care and patient outcomes. I will discuss challenges and achievements using the example of the successful UK National Neonatal Research Database, now in its 17th year, how this approach is being developed for global studies in eNewborn, an International Neonatal Network and Research Database, and how India might become a part of this exciting innovation.

There is growing appreciation of the potential of real-world data (data recorded as part of routine clinical care), and registries or databases of real-world data. This is largely because the cost of clinical research is rising and the number of high impact studies to improve mother and baby care is falling. Registries of real-world data provide opportunity to make clinical research and other activities that benefit patients, easier, less costly, more efficient and less burdensome

We established the UK National Neonatal Research Database (NNRD) in 2007. This is globally unique because it contains data on all babies admitted to neonatal units in England, Scotland and Wales and hence all sick and all very preterm babies with no restrictions based on gestational age, birthweight, level of care, or other criteria. Data are a standard extract from Electronic Patient Records comprising around 450 variables, many recorded daily. The data are quality-assured to be reliable and are updated quarterly. To-date the NNRD includes data on \sim 1.5 million patients and currently supports research funded to \sim £25M.

ENewborn was established in 2020. Neonatal units from 17 countries already contribute to eNewborn, and we invite the participation of neonatal units in India to become national champions and participate in research to resolve globally important clinical care uncertainties.

Registry data are observational data. Observational data are often used to identify associations. However, it is important not to conflate association with causation. Observational data can be analysed using a number of sophisticated techniques aimed at maximising causal inferences. These include instrumental variable analyses, matching techniques, and a variety of data science approaches to ensure balance in measured and unmeasured unknown confounders between groups that are being compared. The richer and more granular the data in a registry, the greater will be the ability to deal with confounders.

I will provide examples of how observational data are being used to drive advances. These include data provision for legislative change, health policy development, health services research, medicines development, precision-medicine studies, audit, national surveillance, bench-marking, quality-improvement, observational studies, and randomised clinical trials. These studies are carried out in partnership with parents, patients, and the public. They tell us repeatedly that they want to see their baby's data being used to improve care. The aim of NNRD and eNewborn is to support multiple outputs representing a convergence of health system needs.



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
